PREVALENCE OF SYPHILIS AMONG FEMALE PRISONERS

Abstract:

Background: Sexually transmitted diseases (STD) constitute important source

of morbidity in incarcerated persons. So we decided to determine incidence of

syphilis among female prisoners in Tehran province prisons (Evin, Varamin and

Rajayii shahr) in order to specify risk factors, precipitated factors and

prophylaxis methods.

Methods: This descriptive study was performed on 500 randomly selected

women. Initial data including age, marital status, economic status, dwelling

place and IV drug abuse were all recorded then they were examined,

and laboratory evaluation RPR and FTAabs were achieved.

Results: Eight female prisoners had syphilis infection positive RPR and

FTAabs). Age, marital status, economic status, and IV drug abuse were

revealed to be significantly associated with acquiring syphilis.

Conclusion: Our results have revealed that syphilis is not rare in female

prisoners. So, screening of high risk prisoners and exerting proper management

is recommended.
